

ELECTION OF THE METROPOLIS BOARD

Qualifications

A candidate for the Metropolis Board must be:

- a) A member in good standing of a Parish
- b) A candidate must have served a local Chapter in an elected capacity for one full term.
- c) A member in good standing in a Philoptochos Chapter for a period of two years.

Composition

The Metropolis Board shall be composed of:

- a) Regular voting members as follows:
 1. Metropolitan shall act as Chairman
 2. Four members appointed by the Metropolitan
 3. Sixteen Members elected at the Metropolis Philoptochos Biennial Conference
 4. Immediate Past President of the Metropolis Board assumes the position of the advisor of the board
- b) Honorary non-voting members, such as;
 1. Former Metropolis Board Presidents

Term of Office

Elections of the Metropolis Board shall be conducted at the Biennial Metropolis Conference.

- a) Two years- No Officers shall hold more than one office concurrently
- b) An elected Officer shall not hold the same office for more than two consecutive years.

Voting Privileges

All members of the Metropolis Executive Board, except the Metropolitan, shall have voting privileges at the meeting.

Election of Officers

The officers of the Metropolis Board, except the Metropolitan and the Advisor, shall be elected by the Members of the Metropolis Board following the election of the Metropolis Board.

Metropolis Philoptochos Executive Board

Composition:

- a) Metropolitan – Chairman
- b) President
- c) 1st Vice President
- d) 2nd Vice President
- e) Recording Secretary
- f) Corresponding Secretary
- g) Treasurer
- h) Assistant Treasurer
- i) Advisor

Appointed Position

All appointed positions can be filled by the Metropolis Board President when a vacancy occurs.

Meetings

- a) Frequency
 - 1) A minimum of two executive board meetings annually
- b) Quorum
 - 1) A quorum for a meeting shall consist of one half plus one of voting members.

Termination and Vacancy

Absence:

- a) A Board Member may resign by serving a written notice to the Metropolitan, the President, and/or the Secretary of the Board. Reasons other than illness or family emergency shall be equivalent to resignation.

Resignation:

- a) The resigning member shall surrender all books, records, and property of the Metropolis Board.
